

Christmas Assistance

Greenfield-Central families who are in need of Christmas assistance will once again be helped this year through the United Christmas Service (UCS), a division of the United Way. Applications will be available on the Harris website on Friday, October 5th, and will be accepted at the school beginning on October 22nd, and continuing through November 17th. Those families needing a hard copy form may pick one up in the Parent Resource Center, the school office or from Mrs. Nichter, the school social worker. Once the application is filled out

with all requested information, it should be returned to Mrs. Nichter, no later than November 17th. This application will require information on <u>each</u> member of the household, such as name, gender, birth date, ethnicity, social security number, school attending, clothing sizes, and reason for need. Families may be assisted through Direct Assistance (a restricted voucher system which can only be spent on food, clothing, and/or toys), by the Donor Program (which matches the families with the greatest need to a donor

group), or by a community service group which will provide assistance according to their program guidelines. United Christmas Service will assist as many families as possible; however no one is guaranteed assistance.

Safety During Arrival and Dismissal

Please remember that ALL car traffic should be at the north (back) side of the building. Follow the flow of traffic or park your car in a parking space and walk up to drop off or greet your child. Please do not park in the business parking lots across from Harris. We appreciate your patience and kindness as we work to make sure each child is delivered safely to their vehicle each day.

ONLY BUSES are allowed to drop

off and pick up students in the front of the building each day.

Students walking to and from school should use the sidewalks and cross streets carefully and safely. Students eating breakfast may



enter the building at 7:30 a.m. All other students may enter at 7:40 a.m.

Character Trait- TRUTHFULNESS

During the month of October, we will be learning about the character quality of Truthfulness. This is one of the most valued character qualities. Character First! Defines truthfulness as "Earning future trust by accurately reporting past facts."

The five "I Will" statements are:

- I will tell the truth.
- I will encourage others to tell the truth.
- I will not cheat or steal.
- I will admit it when I am wrong.
- I will not exaggerate to make things seem different than what they are.

When thinking about elementary aged (and younger) students, the "I Will" statements sometimes become difficult. Children of this age might not be able to report details accurately, may misunderstand information, may fear punishment, ridicule, or disapproval, or may simply want to avoid getting into trouble. Whatever the reason, it is important that children learn the value of telling the truth at a young age. To help children learn the benefits of truthfulness, it is important for honesty to be praised.


Mathematics Pentathlon Club will be back in action at Harris Elementary beginning Wednesday, October 24th from dismissal to 3:00. If you want to be part of the Math Pentathlon Club at Harris please complete a registration form available from your classroom teacher or Mrs. Cooney, Math Coach. All students, new or returning to the club, must complete a permission slip. Only those students who have a signed permission slip will be allowed to remain after school for this club.

At dismissal registered students will head to the library, where they will be taught the games and assigned to a group to play that day. Students will be picked up at school at 3:00 PM on these days in the front of the building. There is no charge for this program.
