### Attendance-Key to Success

Harris Elementary is responsible for teaching your child. But we can't do our job if your child is absent. Learning builds day by day. A child who misses a day of school misses a day of learning.

Research shows that children who are in school most of the time do better on state tests. Being late for school hurts a child's learning too. A student who is 10 minutes late every day will miss 30 hours of instruction during the year. Children can make up an assignment, but they can never get back what is most important: the discussions, directions, guestions, explanations by the teacher, and the thinking that makes learning come alive. Your

child's success in school depends on having a solid educational background-one that can only be gained through regular school attendance.

Harris Elementary has issued an attendance challenge. Each day, every class that has perfect attendance displays a pennant outside of their classroom to denote that "we're all here." The students and staff are excited to see the number of classes that are reaching that goal. Individual students who have perfect attendance for the entire year will receive a medal. Harris has set a 97% attendance rate for the entire year.

What: Free developmental screenings for children ages 3-5

Why: If you suspect delays in speech, readiness, motor skills, or other areas of development in your preschool, early intervention is the best strategy to remediate these delays before kindergarten.

# 2-1-1 Connect2Help

2-1-1 is an information and referral line that connects people to vital social services, such as food, clothing, shelter, counseling, legal aid, etc. When a person calls 2-1-1, specially-trained information and referral personnel assess what services are needed and provide the appropriate resource and related information. The service is free and confidential and calls are answered 24 hours per day, 7 days per week. Asking for help early---before eviction occurs or utilities are disconnected—means that more options are available and assistance may be able to be provided before greater debt is incurred.
